Pubs

At the end of the day, or perhaps at lunch-time, what could be better than a pint of Guinness or a meal in a Connemara pub? It will also give you a chance to meet some local people and, every now and then, hear live traditional music. There are popular pubs at the Zetland Country House Hotel, a mile from Doonreagan, and at Ballynahinch Castle Hotel, seven miles away. In Roundstone and Clifden, you'll be spoilt for choice. The bar at the Cashel House Hotel also welcomes visitors to Doonreagan.



RESTAURANTS

With the excellent local produce from sea and land, you eat very well in Connemara. We recommend neighbouring Cashel House Hotel, which offers special rates for our tenants, and the Zetland Country House Hotel 1 mile away. Gourmet dinners are served in their main restaurants, but you can also opt for the Early Bird Menu at Cashel House or the Zetland Bistro, adjacent to Loughlen's Bar. Ballynahinch Castle Hotel offers a similar choice of a main restaurant or less formal meals in the bar – however, these places are very popular during the tourist season, so it's a good idea to book in advance. O'Dowd's and Roundstone House Hotel in Roundstone are also recommended, as are Mitchell's Restaurant and the Steam Café at the Station House in Clifden.
